## **TRIAL BY JURY — THE STORY**

The case to be tried is a breach of promise of marriage. The usher urges on the Jury the necessity for impartiality—" from bias free of every kind this trial must be tried." The Judge honours the Jury with an account of his own somewhat shady rise in his profession, involving marriage to a " rich attorney's elderly, ugly daughter." The Plaintiff, to give pathos to the situation, comes into court in full wedding finery together with her bridesmaids. The subsequent court proceedings are enlivened by the Judge passing billets doux to the First Bridesmaid and Plaintiff. The Defendant offers what he considers to be a reasonable solution to all difficulties—" I'll marry this lady today and I'll marry the other tomorrow." When this is rejected by the Plaintiff's Counsel he attempts to reduce the damages by enlarging on his own defects—" I smoke like a furnace—I'm always in liquor, a ruffian, a bully, a sot." The Judge's response is eminently practical—" He says, when tipsy, he would thrash and kick her ; let's make him tipsy, gentlemen, and try !" Everyone (except the Defendant) shows shocked disagreement, the Judge loses patience and ends the case with a brisk and unanswerable solution—

" Put your briefs upon the shelf, I will marry her myself."

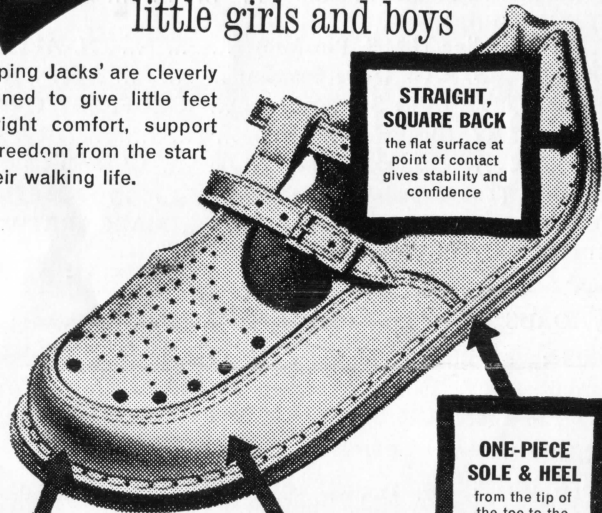

## H.M.S. PINAFORE — THE STORY

H.M.S. Pinafore has just docked in Portsmouth Harbour and Mrs. Cripps (Little Buttercup), the bumboat woman, comes aboard to sell her wares to the crew but says that beneath her frivolity there lurks a "canker-worm." On board ship, the smartest lad is Ralph Rackstraw, who has fallen in love with Josephine, the Captain's daughter. After a bright entry "My gallant crew, good morning" the Captain confesses to Buttercup that he is sad because Josephine spurns the suit of Sir Joseph Porter, the First Lord of the Admiralty. Josephine admits that she really loves a common sailor but she is persuaded by her father to remember her position.

Sir Joseph, accompanied by an admiring crowd of sisters, cousins and aunts, gives an interesting account of how he came to be "ruler of the Queen's Navee" and affirms that the British sailor is any man's equal—except his! Ralph, on hearing this, considers himself a fit suitor for the Captain's daughter, and declares his love to Josephine but is spurned because of his poor rank. When Ralph threatens to commit suicide Josephine relents and the couple, helped by the crew, prepare to elope that night.

Dick Deadeye tells the Captain of this plot "Kind Captain I've important information" and the Captain surprises them eloping. He is so shocked that he utters "a great big D" which is overheard by Sir Joseph who orders him to retire to his cabin. Sir Joseph learns of Josephine's love for Ralph and is so horrified that he orders Ralph to be loaded with chains.

Buttercup then reveals the secret that was the canker worm in her heart. "When I was young and charming I practised baby farming"—she had nursed two babes, one of high and one of low condition, and had mixed them up. The well-born babe was Ralph, the other was the Captain! Sir Joseph orders them to be brought to him and Ralph enters dressed as the Captain, the Captain dressed as a common sailor. Sir Joseph could not possibly marry Josephine now, since she is the daughter of a common sailor, and gives her to Ralph. Buttercup and the Captain also embrace and Cousin Hebe, seizing her chance with her favourite relative, vows never to desert Sir Joseph. He agrees in a resigned tone that their own vows shall be plighted.
