ACT II

In the picture gallery of Ruddigore Castle, Robin is confronted by his ancestors led by his uncle the late Sir Roderic, who step down from their frames to torture him until he promises to commit a worthy crime, such as carrying off a lady. Despard and Mad Margaret, now living a blameless life, beg Robin to reform. He agrees to do so and defy his ancestors, when to his horror, his henchman, old Adam, returns with the maiden, Dame Hannah, who attacks him with a dagger. Robin appeals to Sir Roderic for help, and he and Hannah recognise each other as lovers of long ago. Robin has an idea. A baronet of Ruddigore can only die through refusing to commit his daily crime, which is tantamount to suicide, but suicide is a crime, so Roderic should not have died. Roderic therefore resumes his existence, and is united with Hannah Robin is free to marry Rose, and Richard finds happiness with one of the bridesmaids.
