"THE SORCERER"

SYNOPSIS

It is a lively scene in the village of Ploverleigh. Sir Marmaduke's son Alexis is to be officially betrothed to Lady Sangazure's daughter Aline and the villagers catch the spirit of the occasion. But not everyone is happy as we learn when Mrs. Partlet enters with her daughter Constance. To her mother's considerable surprise, Constance confesses that the man for whom she yearns is none other than Dr. Daly, the elderly Vicar, who at that precise moment appears and meditates upon the passing of the years. Mrs. Partlet puts out a few feelers on her daughter's behalf but Dr. Daly professes himself resigned to bachelordom.

It seems everyone is in the mood for making confessions, for Sir Marmaduke also reveals that, fifty years ago he was in love with his son's future mother-in-law, Lady Sangazure.

The mood changes when Aline and Alexis are ushered in by the villagers and immediately become preoccupied with each other. Lady Sangazure and Sir Marmaduke finding themselves alone, indulge in a duet, first speaking out boldly, then, in asides, revealing their inner feelings.

But the time has come for the signing of the marriage contract and, this completed, Aline and Alexis are left alone. So carried away is Alexis by his own prospect of happiness that he decides that everyone in the village must share it. He will distribute a love philtre from J. W. Wells & Co., the old-established firm of family sorcerers. Conveniently, Mr. Wells is in the refreshment tent and comes at once to Alexis's call. At Alexis's bidding, Aline fetches a large teapot which Mr. Wells fills up with the love philtre, explaining that it has no effect on married people. He promptly engages in strange incantations. The villagers are in gay mood as the cups are passed round. Soon they begin to feel the effects of the philtre and collapse insensible on the ground.

It is midnight. All the peasants are asleep in the moonlight. Soon they begin to rouse and the first shock occurs when Constance arrives in tears leading on the deaf old notary who has presided at the betrothal ceremony.

Alexis makes a wrong tactical move when he suggests to Aline that they, too, ought to drink the philtre so that he might be assured of her love forever. She sharply refuses. Sir Marmaduke has, however, taken the philtre and, to everyone's astonishment, enters arm-in-arm with Mrs. Partlet.

Mr. Wells is by now getting worried about the wholesale and unexpected effects of his drug—even more so when Lady Sangazure catches sight of him, is instantly fascinated and swoops down on him. He protests vigourously, while she becomes more tenderly insistent.

Aline has by now changed her mind and decided to abide by Alexis's wishes. She drinks the philtre and immediately falls into a stupor as Dr. Daly enters. They meet with the now familiar result and burst into a rapturous duet. Alexis arrives, embraces Aline, and is amazed when she rejects him. Dr. Daly makes a magnarimous offer to quit the country but Mr. Wells turns up to explain that the spell can be broken if he (Wells) or Alexis yields up his life. The problem is put to the general vote. Mr. Wells must be the victim and so all is restored to normality.

HISTORICAL NOTE

THE SORCERER was the first two-act opera by Gilbert & Sullivan. The casting of it laid the foundations of a company of regular players for whom many roles in subsequent operas were to be specifically written, George Grossmith, Rutland Barrington and Richard Temple now appeared for them for the first time. The Socerer had an initial run of 178 performances at the Opera Comique. It was revived (with alterations and additions) at the Savoy Theatre on 11th October, 1884 and again at the Savoy Theatre on 22nd September, 1898.




